

3. Research, Consultancy and Extension

- 3.1 Initiatives of the IQAC in Sensitizing/Promoting Research Climate in the institution
 - The IQAC circulated the MRP guidelines of UGC, explained about the scheme to all faculty members and motivated to apply for it. Presently, One **Minor** (Telugu dept.) and One **Major** (Hindi dept. Rtd.) Research projects are ongoing.
 - The IQAC also encouraged all the staff members to pursue their PhDs /MPhils through part time or through FDP. At present, five faculty members have registered for their PhD on part time basis and two faculty members have applied for Teacher Fellowship to pursue their PhD through FDP.
 - All the faculty members are encouraged to participate and present papers in State/ National / International seminars and guided to organise such seminars and workshops. During 2013-14, the numbers of State / National level seminars attended and presented papers by the faculty are 21.
 - Moreover, all the students are encouraged to pursue their study projects.

5. Student Support and Progression

- 5.1 Contribution of IQAC in enhancing awareness about Student Support Services
 - In addition to library facilities, the IQAC has been putting efforts to establish an e-class room which is under process and made available to the students by the end of December'2014.
 - Special training to the students to face campus interviews through JKC.
 - Seminar on career guidance has been given to the students through career guidance cell headed by Ms.G.Swapna, Lecturer in Botany on dt: 04.02.2014.
 - New NCC Army unit is established during this academic year jointly with Intermediate Students with special initiatives of Physical director Ms.P.Prameela Rani. However, Efforts have been made to establish a separate NCC wing exclusively for the benefit of undergraduate students.
 - The existing infrastructural facilities of sports and games are made available to all the students. Moreover, Students are constantly encouraged to participate more at University / State / National level events.
 - Each department is advised to give coaching for P.G entrance and other competitive examinations. Following this, a total of about 34 students of various departments (Economics-05, Botany-16, Chemistry-05, Home science-06, English-02) got benefitted by joining P.G Courses.

 - 6.3.1 Curriculum Development

The institution has been following the Curriculum designed and developed by the affiliating University

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

The institution follows the academic calendar of the affiliating University. As per the University calendar, each department prepares an academic action plan and accordingly each faculty member prepares a month wise Teaching plan and Synopsis. Primarily, the teaching method is Lecture method only. In addition, teaching is done through OHPs, PPTs, models and charts. Interactive session takes place as soon as the topic is over. Syndicate method and project based learning do exist. For new and advanced topics invited guest lectures, Seminars and workshops have been conducted with experts in the field. Moreover, class seminars, group discussions; debates are common for every month. Communication skills, employability skills are improved through JKC. MANA TV lessons telecasted by CCE have been regularly followed. Reference books, Magazines, CDs, DVDs, journals are made available for both students and staff in the main library as well as in the departmental library.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

The college has been following the annual pattern of examination as designed by the University. With effect from 2013-14, the 100 marks theory paper has been divided into 80 marks for external (by University) and 20 marks for internal evaluation (by respective departments). Under this annual pattern also continuous evaluation has been followed internally by giving daily assignments, conducting slip tests, two unit tests before half yearly and two unit tests after half yearly and a Pre-final examination.

6.3.4 Research and Development

- The ongoing UGC Sponsored research projects are: One Minor Research Project (MRP) has been carrying out by Dr.D.Krishna Gayathri, Lecturer in Telugu and One Major Research Project (MRP) has been carrying out by Mrs.P.Prabhavathi, Lecturer in Hindi (Rtd) under the financial assistance of UGC. All staff members are advised to apply for more number of MRPs.
- Five faculty members have registered for PhD under part-time basis.
- Faculty members are encouraged to pursue PhD under UGC-FDP Scheme also.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

The total carpet area of the Central library is 4992 Sq. Ft. The numbers of departmental libraries are 16. The average carpet area of departmental libraries is 60 Sq. Ft. The seating capacity of central library reading hall is 75. The total number of text books in the library is 34538. During the academic year 2013-14, a total of 1874 text books are purchased for Rs: 292131. The total numbers of reference books are 1389. The total numbers of journals are 133. During 2013-14, 109 journals are purchased for Rs: 3740. There are 140 CDs & DVDs, and other books viz., encyclopaedias and sports books are 39. Automation and computerisation of library is under process. The library is equipped with a computer, a photocopy machine and reading facilities.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

- Broadly, the central decision making authority on Recruitment, Selection and Introduction
 of Personnel is the Govt. of A.P through its executive organ CCE (Commissionerate of
 Collegiate Education), Hyderabad. However, the important administrative decisions of
 staff council, various committees and IQAC are placed before the CPDC (College
 Planning and Development Council) for its approval.
- Moreover, the College Staff Council, IQAC and CPDC makes and executes its decisions
 at the Institution level within its boundaries viz., in the aspects of Institutional Planning,
 Personnel administration, Training and development of Staff and students, performance
 monitoring and reward management, Talent hunting ,Student career planning etc.,
- Faculty development is done through Orientation Courses, Refresher courses and other training programmes.
- Tutor Ward system is observed for regulating student activity.
- Student's Union opinion has been taken on important decisions.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

• The faculty and staff recruitment is done by the Govt of A.P through APPSC (Andhra Pradesh Public Service Commission) and also through promotions and transfers. However, the vacant posts are engaged with Contract, Guest faculty and outsourcing staff.

6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

As per the academic action plan each department organizes field trips and industrial visits.

- The Department of Home Science organized a field visit on dt: 15.02.2014 and visited Deccan Sugars Ltd., located at Samalkot.
- The Department of Commerce organized a field trip and visited GMR Power Ltd on dt: 04.02.2014.
- The Department of Zoology organized a field trip and visited SIFT (State Institute of Fisheries Technology) on dt: 06.02.2014.
- The Department of History and Economics jointly organized a field trip and visited Antharvedi on dt: 11.12.2013.
- The Department of Political Science organized a field trip and visited Kakinada Municipal Corporation (KMC) on dt: 13.12.2013.

6.3.9 Admission of Students

Admission process is open, transparent and made on merit basis. Government / University norms are followed in selections. There is no specific cut off mark in the selection procedure. Admissions are made for general, self finance and vocational courses. Reviews are made at every step to see the entire process transparent and tact in projecting the procedural values in selecting the candidates.
