



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1.4 Whether there is any revision/update of regulation or syllabi, if yes, mention their salient aspects.

- The college is affiliated to Adikavi Nannaya University till 2015-16.. As per University rules the college is following university syllabus only. The University has changed its syllabus and question paper pattern w.e.f 2013-14. In 2015-16 under the new pattern of question paper for II year and III year Degree students the 100 marks paper is split up into 80 (external) + 20 (internal).
- The College has become Autonomous in 2015-16 and First Year UG Courses in 2015-16 followed Semester System, CBCS Pattern. Under the Autonomy and Semester system for I year UG Students 100 marks paper is split into 75(external) +25 (internal).
- Semester System is initiated and introduced at State level by revamping and updating the existing pattern and syllabi as per the UGC and XII Plan HEI Policies.
- A.P State Commissionerate of Higher Education and Adi Kavi Nannaya University the Parent University have accordingly revised the syllabi w.e.f 2015-16. Hence for the Academic year 2015-16 the college adopted the revised and updated syllabus in all Subjects . In 2015-16 syllabus was modified in Home science up to 20% for I Semester.
- Syllabus will be revamped according to needs (10-20%) in r the academic year 2016-17 under autonomy and CBCS system to meet the current requirements of students making it more socially relevant ,job oriented and knowledge intensive by taking inputs/ suggestions from professionals, Academicians and experts from industries and the corporate sectors.



3. Research, Consultancy and Extension

3.1 Initiatives of the IQAC in Sensitizing/Promoting Research Climate in the institution

- The IQAC circulated the MRP guidelines of UGC, explained the scheme to all faculty members and motivated to apply for it. Presently, One Minor (Telugu dept.) and One Major (Hindi dept. Rtd.) Research projects have been completed.
- During 2014-15 two Proposals for Minor Research projects are submitted to UGC. One Minor Research Project is sanctioned (Jan 2015) to Physical Education department.
- During 2015-16 One Minor Research Projects one from Dept of Microbiology submitted to UGC. One Minor Research project from physical Education Dept is going on.
- The IQAC also encouraged all the staff members to pursue their PhDs /MPhils through part time or through FDP. At present, Four faculty members have registered for their PhD on part time basis and two faculty members are pursuing their PhD through UGC Teacher Fellowship - FDP.
- All the faculty members are encouraged to participate and present papers in State/ National / International seminars and guided to organise such seminars and workshops.
- One National Workshop was organized by Dept of History with UGC PBDG Grant on 2.6.2016 and One District level Seminar was Organized by Dept of Botany on District Resource Centre Platform on 16.12.2015.
- During 2015-16, a total of 25 papers of faculty members were published in various National and International Seminars / Conference Proceedings.
- All the students are encouraged to pursue study projects, a total of 33 projects have been completed by the students from 10 departments during 2015-16.




Criterion – V 5. Student Support and Progression

5.1 Contribution of IQAC in enhancing awareness about Student Support Services

- IQAC has been putting efforts continuously to upgrade the student support services and to enhance the quality in services.

NCC wing during 2015-16 has actively participated in all activities at District /University/State/national level.
- The existing infrastructural facilities of sports and games are made available to all the students. Moreover, Students are constantly encouraged to participate more at University / State / National level events. In 2015-16 Students participated and won several prizes in sports and games at District/University/Yuvatarangam/State levels.
- Each department is advised to give coaching for P.G entrance and other competitive examinations. Following this initiative, a total of 72 students from 11 departments (Viz., Telugu-05, English-02, History-02, Economics-07, Commerce-30, Mathematics-02, Chemistry-05, Botany-08, Physics-02, Zoology-03, MicroBiology-04, Home science-07) got benefitted by joining P.G Courses.

- Quick response and swift action on student related issues and institutional developmental initiatives / Plans through Staff council, CPDC and advisory committees.




5.4 Details of student support mechanism for coaching for competitive examinations (if any)

6. Governance, Leadership and Management

6.1 State the Vision and Mission of the institution

- Provide need- based and skill- based training to develop a workforce of women with abilities to globally compete to be entrepreneurs, to be self reliant.

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

- The institution has been followed the Curriculum designed and developed by the affiliating University until 2014-15. The University has changed its syllabus and question paper pattern w.e.f 2013-14. In 2015-16 under the new pattern of question paper for II year and III year Degree students the 100 marks paper is split up into 80 (external) + 20 (internal).
- In 2015-16 Semester System is introduced all over he state uniformly and new syllabus has been Introduced in all subjects by APSCHE and the Parent University. Initiating Autonomy & Semester system the College has adopted the new revised syllabus during 2015-16.
 - The College has become Autonomous in 2015 -16 and First Year Degree Courses in 2015-16 followed Semester System, CBCS Pattern .Under the Autonomy, under Semester system for I year Degree Students 100 marks paper is split into 80 (external) +20 (internal).
- During the Academic year 2015-16 all Subjects except Home science followed newly revamped University Syllabus as the initial process of Autonomy. Changes in syllabus are made in Home science up to 20%.
- However for the academic year 2016-17 under autonomy and CBCS, the college has worked out on the syllabus in all subjects thus has modified the syllabi (10-20%) to meet the current needs of students and stakeholders as permissible under Autonomy.
- While revamping every care is taken keeping in mind the 'needs' that exist at the regional and National levels and to make it socially relevant, job oriented and knowledge intensive.
- The identification of thrust areas are done by taking inputs from professionals from other fields, Academicians of other disciplines, and experts from industries and the corporate sectors for updating the quality of the curriculum.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- The Institution has followed the Academic calendar of the Affiliating University. The State level Academic Calendar prepared by Commissioner of Collegiate Education, Government of Andhra Pradesh acts as a guideline for preparation of Institutional plan.
- At college level IQAC prepares Institutional Plan and Academic calendar well in advance keeping in view the 90 teaching days required in a semester and conduct of the approved scheme of instruction and evaluation for various courses.
- This exercise is a collaborative endeavor involving all In charges of the Departments and Staff members, Academic Coordinator, IQAC Coordinator, Controller of Examination and the Autonomy Committee.
- Each department prepares an academic action plan and accordingly each faculty member prepares a month wise Teaching plan and Synopsis.
- While adopting Lecture method to reach out to the students of varied comprehension levels, various supportive and supplementary strategies are adopted such as the use of ICT gadgets(OHPs, PPTs, Videos , Pdfs), teaching aids such as Models , specimens, charts ,slides. Interactive session takes place as soon as the topic is covered.
- Syndicate method and project based learning do exist. For new and advanced topics invited guest lectures, Seminars and workshops are conducted with experts in the field. Moreover, class seminars, group discussions; debates are common for every subject.
- Communication skills, employability skills are improved through JKC training . MANA TV lessons telecast by CCE are supplementary to teaching. Reference books, Magazines, CDs, DVDs, journals are made available for both students and staff in the main library as well as in the departmental libraries.
- More importance is given to student centric teaching methods primarily in science departments like project works, Group works, Field works, Industrial tours, lab to land, giving on line assignments, video lessons etc.
- In Humanities and Social Sciences task based activities, peer and group learning, seminars, study projects, study tours etc are followed.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

- The College followed the annual pattern of examination as designed by the University for II &III UG students in 2015-16. 100 marks theory paper has been divided into 80 marks for external (by University) and 20 marks for internal evaluation (by respective departments) as per university Examination Pattern.
- Continuous evaluation has been done internally by giving Assignments, conducting tests, two unit tests, quarterly, half yearly and Pre-final examinations.
- College is conferred with Autonomous status in 2015-16 Academic Year and adopted semester system . As a part of Examination reforms, the college has introduced grading system based on CGPA score on 10 point scale from the academic year 2015-16.

- One Major Research Project (MRP) has been submitted to UGC during 2015-16 by Mrs.P.Prabhavathi, Lecturer in Hindi (Rtd) in March 2016.
- > One Minor Research project is ongoing from Dept of Physical Education
- > One faculty member applied for UGC Minor Research Project in 2015-16.
- Two faculty members have registered for PhD on part-time basis at Nagarjuna University and Padmavathi Univrsity.
- Two Faculty members selected for UGC-FDP Teacher Fellowship to pursue PhD at University of Delhi and Andhra University Respectively.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

- The total carpet area of the Central library is 4992 Sq. Ft. The numbers of departmental libraries are 16. The average carpet area of departmental libraries is 60 Sq. Ft. The seating capacity of central library reading hall is 75. The total number of text books in the library is 37,538. During the academic year 2015-16, a total of 4,427 are added.
- The total numbers of reference books are 1409. The total numbers of journals are 291. There are 140 CDs & DVDs, and other books viz., encyclopaedias and sports books are 39. Automation and computerisation of library has been done during 2014-15. The library is equipped with computers, a photocopy machine and reading facilities.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management.

- Administration at the institution level is decentralised. Committees are formed involving Teaching and Non Teaching staff for executing virus administrative responsibilities/tasks to ensure participation and transparency.
- Academic committees actively partake in planning, performing and achieving academic goals.
- Authority on Recruitment, Selection and Induction of Personnel is the Govt. of A.P through its executive organ CCE (Commissionerate of Collegiate Education), Hyderabad. However, at institutional level the important administrative decisions of staff council, various committees and IQAC are placed before the CPDC (College Planning and Development Council) for its approval.
- The College Staff Council, IQAC and CPDC make and execute decisions at the Institution level in the aspects of Institutional Planning, Personnel administration, Training and development of Staff and students, performance monitoring and reward management, Talent hunt ,Student career planning etc.,
- Faculty development is done through Orientation Courses, Refresher courses and other training programmes.
- > Tutor Ward System is in operation for monitoring student progress.
- Student's Union opinion is taken on important decisions. Student representatives take part in quite a few Academic and administrative committees.
- > Parents and Alumni are involved in various committees of policy making.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff Recruitment.

- The faculty and staff recruitment is done by the Govt of A.P through APPSC (Andhra Pradesh Public Service Commission) and also through promotions and transfers.
- However, the vacant posts are engaged with Guest faculty at the institutional level . 8 Guest faculty are engaged in 2015-16.

6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

- All Departments organized field trips, industrial visits, Skill development and Employability initiatives ,MOUs as per their academic action plan.
- During 2014-15 the Department of Commerce entered into MOU (Memorandum of Understanding) with Coastal Prosoft Pvt. Ltd, Kakinada, to provide training facility for the Govt. of India Sponsored Diploma courses viz., Advanced Diploma in Software Technology (ADST) and Diploma in PC Hardware & Networking (DPCHN).
- The Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Government of India provides training stipend (Rs: 1,500/-per month) to the SC / OBC Students of B.A/B.Sc/B.Com Courses. The Training Certificates would be issued by ECIL (Electronic Corporation of India Limited), Hyderabad. A total of 36 Students from this College underwent training in DPCHN (3 Months duration) and ADST (6 Months duration) during 2015-16.
- During 2015-16 companies like Infotech, Techmahindra, Institute of Prominere solutions, Emigo software solutions, ICICI Bank visited campus for placements and 24 students got placements.
- JKC entered into an MOU with International School of Advanced Networking (iSAN) for training students on Hardware and Networking , 3 courses for employment.

- During 2015-16 the Department of Chemistry organized an Industrial trip and visited Siva Sakthi Soap works, Kovvur Road, Kakinada on 28.1.2016.
- Department of Botany organized a field trip and visited Yanam Floral Exhibition and Nurseries on 8.1.2016 for comparitive study of floral characters family wise in Angiosperms.
- Department of Commerce organized an Industrial trip and visited Bharatiya Mahila Bank on 16.10.2015 to study Banking activities and facilities of a Mahila Bank.
- Department of Home Science organized Study and field tours and visited VLCC Kakinada on 13.8.2015 to learn about beauty courses and Entrepreneurship.
- Department of Zoology visited SIFT (State Institute of Fisheries Technology) on 25.1.2016 and studied the process of pisciculture.

6.9 What efforts are made by the University/ Autonomous College for Examination Reforms?

- ➢ For II and III UG students presently, annual pattern of examination has been followed by the college. With effect from 2013-14, the 100 marks theory paper has been divided into 80 marks for external (by University) and 20 marks for internal evaluation (by respective departments). College is following the same annual pattern as university.
- The college has been conferred with autonomy in the year 2015-16. Since then the college has initiated the Semester system and the students have been evaluated continuously by two internal assessments per semester.
- As a part of Examination reforms, the college has introduced grading system based on CGPA score on 10 point scale from the academic year 2015-16.
- There is a continuous internal evaluation for 25 marks through mute mode assessment which includes assignment, seminars, and two written tests per semester. The end semester exam (External evaluation) is for 75 marks.
- From 2015-16 in the CBCS pattern, 25% of marks are earmarked for Continuous Internal Assessment by conducting written test(15 marks), seminar (5 marks), Assignment(5 marks) to test the students extensive as well as intensive knowledge of the subject .The end semester exam is for 75 marks. (Attendance marks in future)
- Credits for NCC,NSS, Attendance etc is under active consideration for future Implementation.
