All the stakeholders' feedback data was collected and analyzed as per the following tables of the academic year 2020-21.

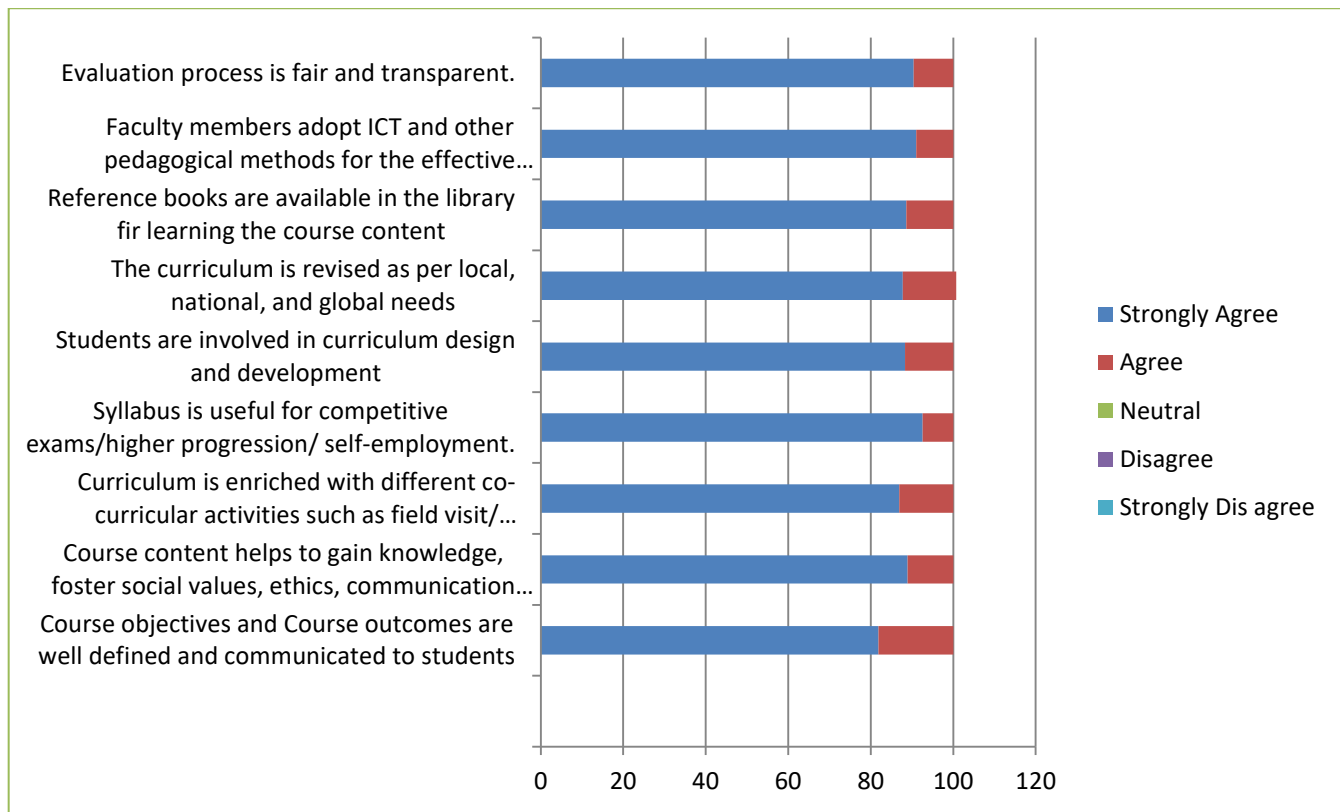
### Student feedback on Curricula

### Students Feedback on Curriculum:

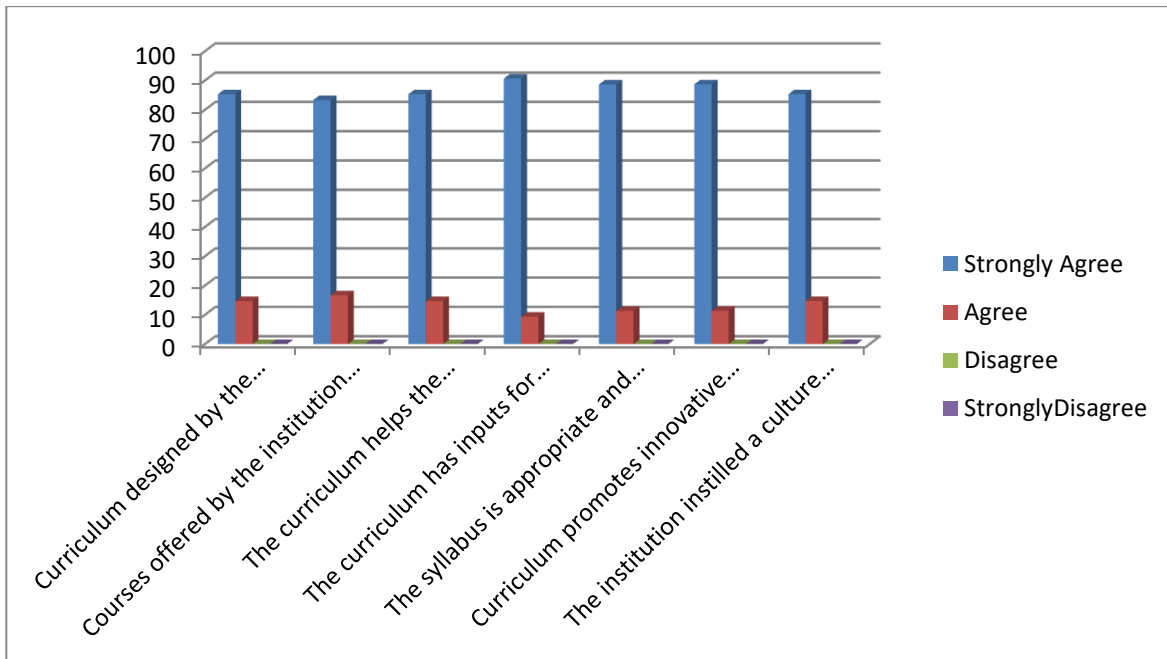

2. By using demonstrations and smart learning tools Syllabi made more interesting and relevant and easier for students.

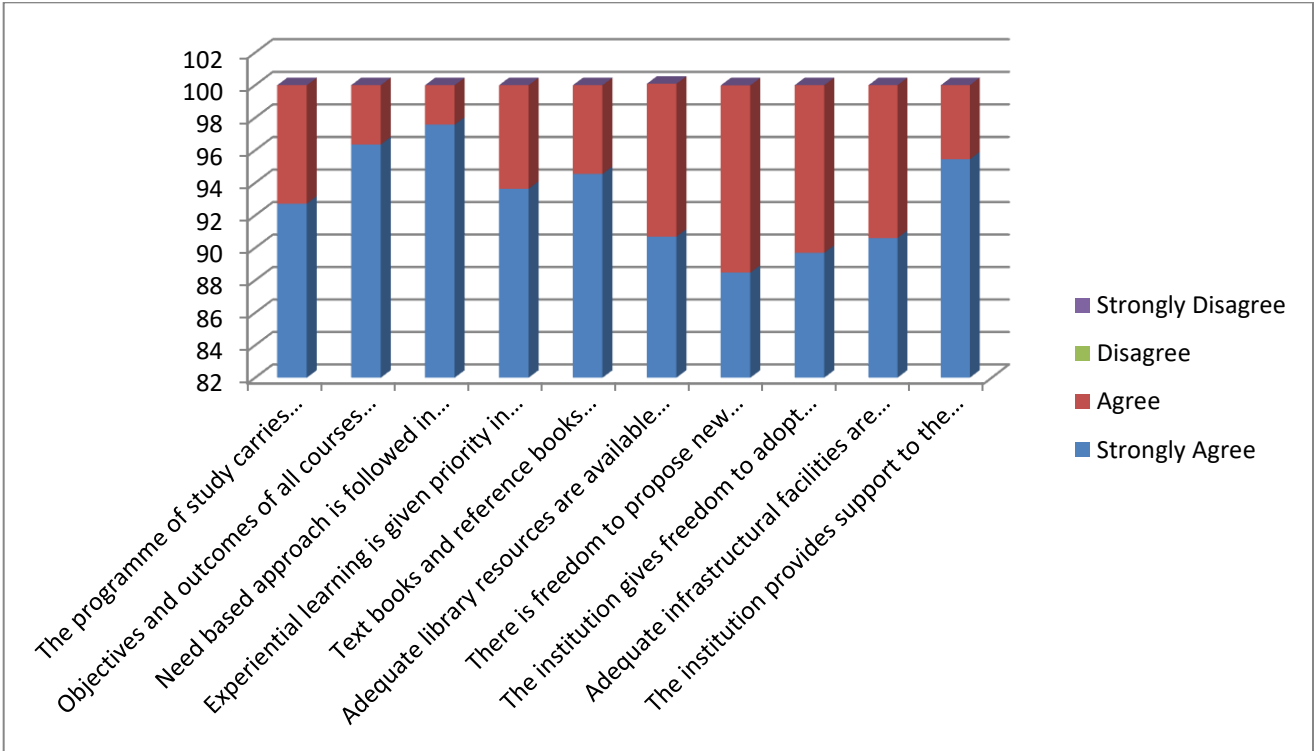

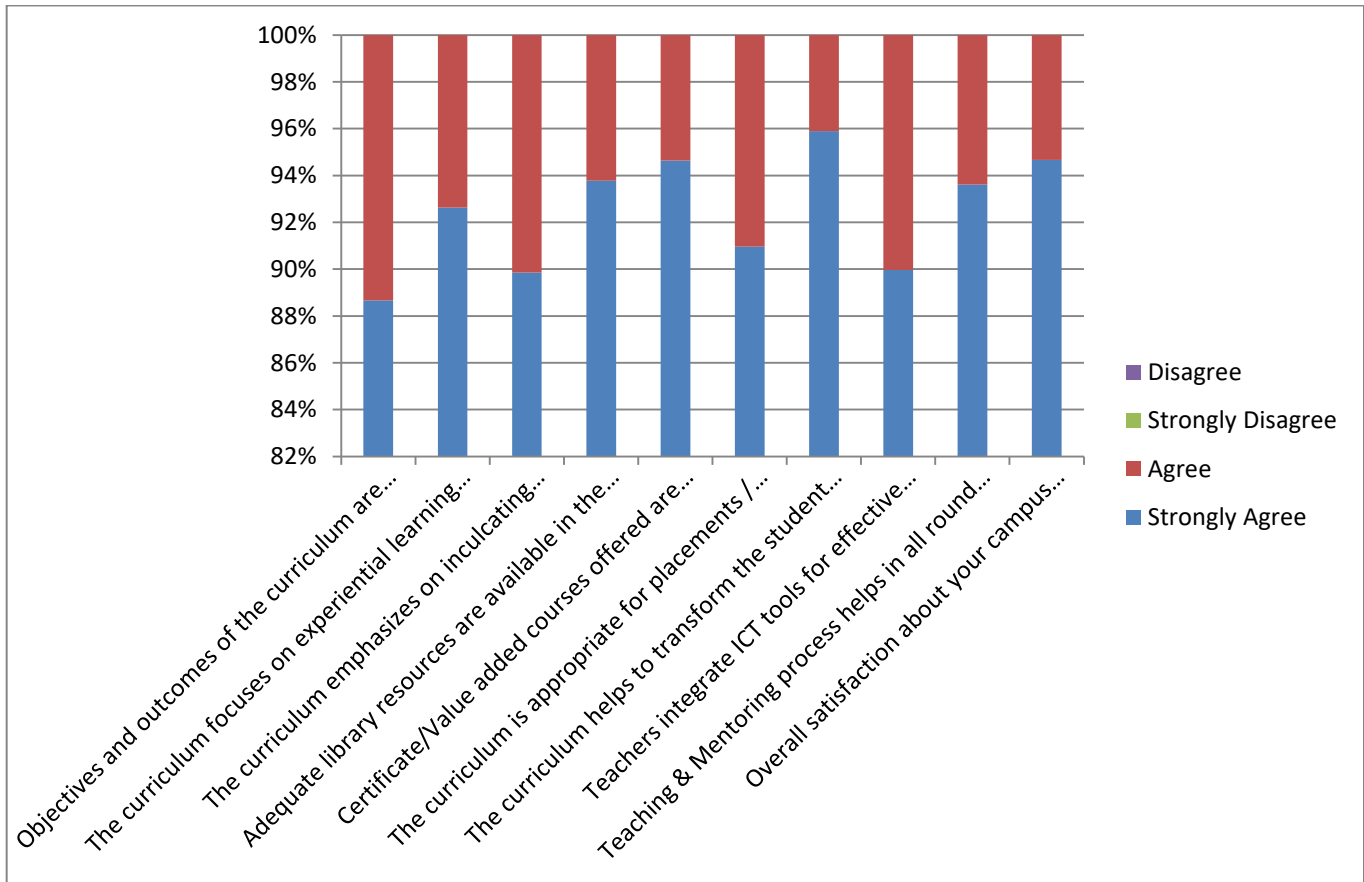
