



## Brief Report on the Activity

The Department of History along with Political Science arranged a Guest Lecture on 12.07.2024 at 3 P.M in the seminar Hall. DrVadrevu Sundarao, Retd. Commerce Lecturer in GDC, Tanuku invited as speaker and Sri V. Rama Krishna, Social service organizer of Gandhian Philosophy as guest of honour. DrVadrevu Sundarao addressed the students and spoke about the Role of women in the Indian Freedom Movement especially about the life history of Smt. Duvvuri Subbamma as a women freedom fighter. He also praised the services of Duvvuri Subbamma rendered in the freedom movement.

**Duvvuri Subbamma** (15 November 1880 – 31 May 1964) was an Indian independence activist who played an important role in the Indian independence movement. She was one of the founders of the women's congress committee. Subbamma was born in 1880 in Draksharamam, East Godavari district, Andhra Pradesh. A child bride, she was married at the age of ten. She was widowed at a very young age. After her husband's death, she took up activism and joined the Quit India Movement against the British Raj. She took part in the civil disobedience movement and strongly advocated total freedom from British rule in India.

In 1922, she organized the women's congress committee. In 1923, she organized a meeting in Kakinada, Andhra Pradesh, where hundreds of women volunteers attended the Kakinada Congress Mahasabha. Subbamma organized Andhra Mahila Sabhas that trained and educated women in the national freedom movement and was instrumental in galvanizing support of the women in the Indian independence movement. She extensively travelled throughout Andhra Pradesh promoting women's empowerment. Together with other activists like Nadimpalli, Sundaramma helped set up the Goteti Manikyamba, Andhra Mahasabha, and T. Varakshamma organizations. Subbamma was arrested and incarcerated in the Rajahmundry prison for one year due to her activities on behalf of the civil disobedience movement. She also spent a year in the Rayavellore prison for taking part in the Salt March. She aggressively spoke out and worked for the abolition of untouchability in India. She is memorialized with a bust in the Freedom Park in Rajahmundry.

Sri V. Rama Krishna, Social service organizer of Gandhian Philosophy spoke about the services of Mahatma Gandhi and his principles to the Indian society.

Nearly 10 students of III B.A asked some questions and clarified their doubts.

The programme ended with the National Anthem.

## Brief Report

**Duvvuri Subbamma** (15 November 1880 – 31 May 1964) was an Indian independence activist who played an important role in the Indian independence movement. She was one of the founders of the women's congress committee. Duvvuri Subbamma was born at Draksharama, Ramachandrapuram taluk of East Godavari District. She was the daughter of Malladi Subbavadhani and the wife of Duvvuru Venkayya.

Subbamma was born in 1880 in Draksharamam, East Godavari district, Andhra Pradesh. A child bride, she was married at the age of ten. She was widowed at a very young age.

In 1922, she organized the women's congress committee. In 1923, she organized a meeting in Kakinada, Andhra Pradesh, where hundreds of women volunteers attended the Kakinada Congress Mahasabha. Subbamma organized Andhra Mahila Sabhas that trained and educated women in the national freedom movement and was instrumental in galvanizing support of the women in the Indian independence movement. She extensively travelled throughout Andhra Pradesh promoting women's empowerment. She took an active part in the freedom struggle and was the second among the early ladies who participated in the Non-Cooperation Movement of India and was imprisoned in 1922. After release from the Rajahmundry Jail she again participated in the Salt Satyagraha and was incarcerated for six months from 31 May 1930 in the Vellore Jail. Subbamma was a very powerful speaker who could sway people with her eloquence. She was lathi-charged at 'Peddapuram' during the Quit India Movement in 1942. She served as a member, Stree Sanatana Vidyalayam, Rajahmundry. The title '*Desa Bandhavi*' was conferred on her by the Kakinada Congress Maha Sabha in 1923. As an ardent freedom fighter and a devoted Gandhian follower, she won the appreciation of Gandhiji for her courage and zeal.

Together with other activists like Nadimpalli, Sundaramma helped set up the Goteti Manikyamba, Andhra Mahasabha, and T. Varakshamma organizations. Subbamma was arrested and incarcerated in the Rajahmundry prison for one year due to her activities on behalf of the civil disobedience movement. She also spent a year in the Rayavellore prison for taking part in the Salt March. She aggressively spoke out and worked for the abolition of untouchability in India. She is memorialized with a bust in the Freedom Park in Rajahmundry
