The Department of Botany recognized the need to reconnect with these age-old traditions by promoting awareness about the importance of medicinal plants in maintaining health. With the increasing popularity of herbal and natural remedies, this drive aims to provide a platform for both students and the local community to understand the value of medicinal plants and adopt them in daily life.

The campus provides an ideal setting for such an initiative, with the availability of land for growing and cultivating medicinal plants.

The Practice:

- Faculty & students of the Department conducts Medicinal plant drive every year which includes activities like organizing awareness programmes such as workshops, and interactive sessions to the Experts from the field of herbal medicine and Botany were invited to share their knowledge about medicinal plants and their uses in health and wellness to the Staff and Students . Faculty & Students are given knowledge about medicinal importance of plants used as Vinayaka Chavithi Patri
- A medicinal garden on the campus was established to grow a variety of medicinal plants. This garden includes plants such as *Ocimum sanctum* (Tulasi), *Aloe Vera*, *Costus igneus* (Insulin Plant), *Cissus quandrangularis* (Nalleru), *Vitex nigundo* (Vavili) and others known for their therapeutic properties.
- Department of Botany engages the students by organizing field trips, practical demonstrations, and cultivation sessions. Students learn to identify, grow, and care for medicinal plants, gaining first hand experience of their significance.

- The Department of Botany initiated the distribution of free medicinal plant saplings to the local community, faculty, and students, encouraging them to cultivate these plants at home.
- The medicinal plant drive also integrated health and wellness programs where the community was educated about the benefits of using medicinal plants for preventive care, immunity boosting, and first aid.

Through these activities, the department not only educates the people about the importance of medicinal plants but also empowers them to incorporate these natural resources into their health and wellness practices.

Problems Encountered:

- Initially, there was a lack of awareness and interest in medicinal plants, and people were hesitant to adopt traditional remedies due to a strong inclination towards modern medicine.
- Maintaining the medicinal plant garden required consistent care and attention. Issues like pest infestation, water management, and seasonal changes posed challenges to plant growth.
- The available space on campus was limited, making it difficult to grow a wide variety of medicinal plants, especially large ones, within a small area.

Evidence of Success:

- The drive successfully increased awareness about the uses and benefits of medicinal plants. Many students and local community members now actively use medicinal plants for everyday health concerns like immunity, skin care, and digestion.
- The medicinal plant garden has flourished, with an increasing number of plants being cultivated, and it has become a point of interest for faculty and students
- There has been positive feedback from both students and faculty members who have incorporated medicinal plants into their daily lives.
- The local community has actively participated in the drive, with many people learn about the medicinal plants and receive saplings for cultivation.
