Practice:

The Political Science Department conducts a mass reading of the Constitutional Preamble (Preamble Pledge) on the open dais, with all students and staff participating in the pledge. Additionally, the department organizes essay writing, elocution, and quiz competitions for students on the importance of the Indian Constitution. A constitutional pledge is taken along with staff and students, and guest lectures are arranged by inviting eminent person to create awareness about justice, liberty, equality, and fraternity as enshrined in the Indian Constitution.

Every year, the Department of Political Science, along with other faculty members, visits A.S. Junior College for Girls, Kakinada, to conduct a mass reading of the Constitutional Pledge (Preamble Pledge) to reaffirm commitment to its principles.

Awareness Campaigns are conducted to educate citizens about fundamental rights, duties, and the democratic framework of India. Students are encouraged to study the history of the Constitution and its significance.
