
#### STUDENTS FEEDBACK ANALYSIS ON CURRICULUM

The student's feedback form consisted of questions that truly indicated their satisfaction level about the syllabus. Given below are the conclusion obtain by analysing the student's feedback for the academic year 2024-2025.

- ❖ Most of the students (88%) agreed to the statement that: The Syllabus is suitable to the programme, need bases and updated.
- ❖ They syllabus has good balance between theory and application (72%).
- ❖ The syllabus generates interest in the subject area for (75%) of them.
- ❖ The syllabus is relevant to professional development and preparation for job for 73% of them.
- ❖ Around 75% of the syllabus covers recent trends and developments.
- The syllabus prepares and motivated 77% of the pursuer higher education/research.


Student's feedback on Curriculum was obtained for the academic year 2024-25 from 130 respondents.







# 3. Curriculum addresses skill development and enhances Employability and Entrepreneurship skills






 Curriculum focusses on cross-cutting issues like Gender, Human values, Professional Ethics, Environment and Sustainability.



## Action Taken Report on Student Curriculum Feedback (2024–2025)

#### 1. Overview

The Department collected feedback from 130 students to evaluate the effectiveness and relevance of the current curriculum. The analysis highlighted high levels of satisfaction in several key areas, while also indicating specific aspects requiring further attention and enhancement.

#### 2. Action Taken Based on Feedback

Course Objectives and Outcomes	88% of students agreed they are well defined and communicated.	Continued clarity through orientation sessions, course handbooks, and visual aids; outcomes also displayed on department notice boards and LMS.		
Course Content – Skill and Value Orientation	High agreement on relevance to ethics, communication, and leadership. Few suggested updates are needed.	Minor revisions introduced to integrate case studies, role plays, and ethical dilemmas in real-world contexts. Guest lectures by professionals were added.
