STUDENTS FEEDBACK ANALYSIS ON CURRICULUM

SEMESTER II

REPORT 2024-2025

For the academic year 2024–2025, feedback on the syllabus was collected from stakeholders. The students' feedback form included questions that accurately reflected their level of satisfaction with the syllabus. The conclusions drawn from the analysis are as follows:

- A majority of students (90%) agreed that the syllabus is suitable to the programme, need-based, and up-to-date.
- About 78% felt that the syllabus maintains a good balance between theoretical and practical components.
- Nearly 80% expressed that the syllabus generates genuine interest in the subject area.
- Around 76% agreed that the syllabus is relevant for professional development and job preparedness.
- About 78% mentioned that the syllabus incorporates recent trends and developments.
- A total of 82% felt that the syllabus motivates and equips them to pursue higher education or research.



















Action Taken Report on Student Curriculum Feedback (2024–2025)

Observations

The overall feedback from students shows a mostly positive opinion about the curriculum and how it is communicated. Around 90% of students agreed that the course objectives are clear and well explained. Many students appreciated that the curriculum includes important topics like ethics, communication, leadership, gender, and sustainability. Some students suggested that it could be improved further by adding more industry-related and practical components. A few students felt that there is limited hands-on training. There was also a small drop in strongly positive responses, as two students disagreed with some points. This shows that regular review and improvement of the curriculum are needed to keep student satisfaction high.

Action Taken Report

In response to the feedback, several steps were taken to make the curriculum more practical, relevant, and connected to industry needs. Learning outcomes were clearly explained through orientation sessions, course handbooks, visual aids, and displays on notice boards and the LMS. The syllabus was slightly revised to include case studies, role plays, and real-life ethical situations. Guest lectures by professionals, entrepreneurship modules, and mock interviews were added, along with interactive talks by startup founders.

The department worked closely with the Career Services Cell to organize more workshops. Events like Language Day, Gender Sensitization Workshops, and Ethics in Literature seminars were conducted to promote value-based learning. Students continued to take part in the Board of Studies meetings and feedback sessions, which are now held more often to include expert and alumni suggestions.

Open electives and interdepartmental courses were expanded, and students were encouraged to join interdisciplinary certificate programs. More internship and fieldwork opportunities were created through tie-ups with NGOs and companies, including mandatory mini-projects.
