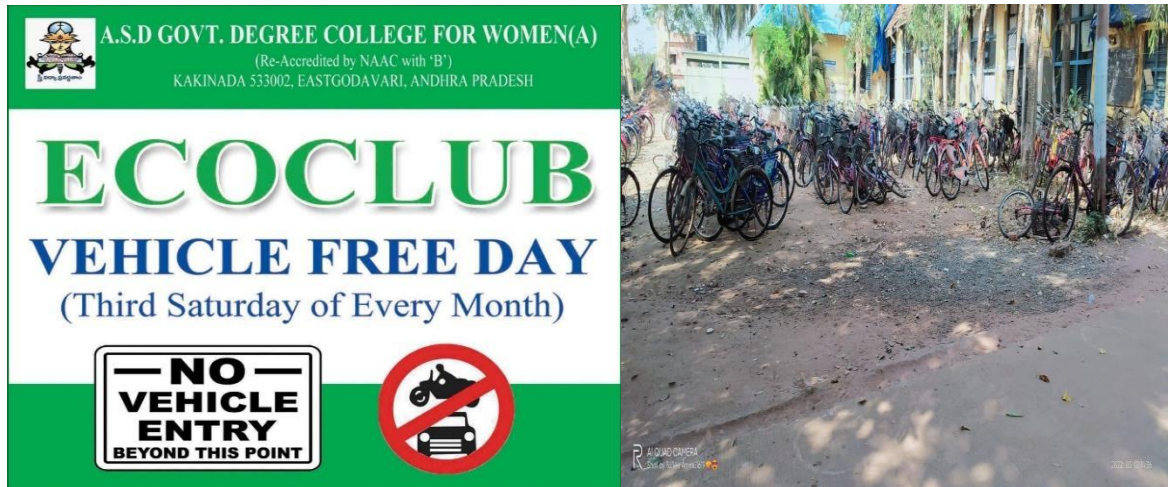
SAMANA
