PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

Annavaram Satyavathi Devi Government Degree College for Women, Kakinada, E. G. District was started with the motto: 'Sthree Vidya Pravardhataam' – 'Women Education Shall Prosper.' The idea came up with the inspiring words: "A Man's education being the education of an Individual, a Woman's education is the education of a Family" - Mahatma Gandhi.

The College made a humble beginning in the year 1962 with the efforts of the eminent women personalities of the town who constituted a committee called 'Women's education society of Kakinada'. The committee handed over the College to the Annavaram Devasthanam Trust in the year 1963 and it was managed by the Trust Board for about five years. Subsequently, in the year 1968, the College was taken over by the Government of Andhra Pradesh. In the year 1996, the College was bifurcated into Junior College and Degree College. Then onwards it has been named 'A.S.D.Govt. Degree College for Women, Kakinada'. The institution is in a prime location of Kakinada town with a campus area of 7.75 acres connected with a good transport facility.

The College has 19 classrooms and 11 well-equipped laboratories. A computerized library has around 40,000 books. It has 22 regular faculty members and 3 contract faculty working to support the principal. The strength of the college is 1319. The college is offering 07 conventional courses, 02 Self-finance courses, 03 Market-Oriented courses and 01 vocational courses of Arts, Commerce and Sciences in UG.

The College started M. Com (Self-finance) and M. A. (Telugu) courses in the 2016 -17 batch with 30 seats each. In addition to the P.G. Course several Certificate courses, Skill Development and Training courses are offered in collaboration with Govt. organizations and NGOs. Jawahar Knowledge Centre (JKC) of the College is imparting training for employability batch-wise all through the year and organizing Campus Drives. The College is receiving funds

from RUSA and UGC for the construction of additional rooms, upgrading existing structures and establishing e-classrooms, labs etc.

ASD Government Degree College for Women (Autonomous), Jagannaickpur, Kakinada is the only Government College for Women for having Autonomous Status and for offering Home Science course in both East &West Godavari districts together. The College is offering B.A. (H.E.P.; T.H.P., H.E.T.), B. Com (TM, EM, & Computer Applications), and B.Sc. MPC [E.M. & T.M.], MPCS, CBZ [E.M. & T.M.], CBMB, H. Sc., CZAqT & B.Sc (Horticulture) in combination with Chemistry and Botany at UG level under Semester System, and M.Com (EM) Self-finance course at PG level. Admissions are in progress on a merit basis. A hostel facility is available both on the campus and in the near vicinity of the College. Along with their curriculum, students will be benefitted through many certificate-based skill enhancement programmes like TCS-ION, IIT-Mumbai Spoken Tutorial, IBM P-Tech and CISCO Certification courses.

The College envisages evolving into a premier institution imparting quality education embedded with Values and Skills leading to the development of the Nation through the empowerment of women, especially those hailing from marginalized sections of the society.

ACADEMIC PLAN

With the approval of the Academic Council, the college may formulate an appropriate mechanism to evaluate its academic performance, academic regulations, instructional and evaluation methods, improvement of standards and relevant procedures.

The common programmes to be adopted are:

- a. Semester pattern of study
- b. Continuous Internal Assessment
- c. Student feedback

The academic year is divided into 2 semesters, each consisting of 90 instructional days.

Odd Semester:

I, II & V Semester - June to October

Even Semester:

II, IV & VI Semester - November to April

Each semester has a continuous Internal Assessment that ensures regular study, monitors

students, performance and enables them to self-evaluate. Continuous Internal Assessment

includes two mid-semester exams, seminars, and assignments. Semester End Examinations are

the comprehensive types with external evaluation. Regular examinations are held twice a year

i.e., in November and April. The respective departments will provide the syllabi and the model

question papers to the students. To fix 35% (26 marks) of 75 marks as a pass percentage in the

External Assessment and 40% (40 marks) of 100 (75+25) in the overall assessment for both

theory and practical. There is no minimum pass marks percentage fixed for the internal

assessment of theory.

Grades and their Numerical Values: Grade in the realm of education are standardized

measurements of varying levels of comprehension of a subject area. Grades can be assigned in

the letters (for example O, A+, A, B+, B, C, D and F). Each letter Grade has a specific Numeric

value assigned. Grades will be awarded on the basis of marks secured on a ten-point scale.

Credit: A unit by which the course work is measured. It determines the number of hours of

instructions required per week. One credit is equivalent to one hour of teaching (lecturer or

tutorial) or two hours of practical work/field work per week.

Credit Point: It is the product of grade point and number of credits for a course.

Grade Point: It is a numerical weight allotted to each letter grade on a 10-point scale.

Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA): It is a measure of performance of work done in a

semester. It is a ratio of total credit points secured by a student in various courses registered in

a semester and the total course credits taken during that semester. It shall be expressed up to

two decimal places.

The UGC recommends a 10- point grading system with the following letter grades as given

below.

<u>Definition of Credit:</u> Credit is the term used to denote a unit of learning, usually measured in hours of study or achievement of threshold standard or both.

A credit is a value assigned to a course, usually one credit equals one hour class period per week.

1. Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA): It is a measure of performance of work done in a semester. It is ratio of total credit points secured by a student in various courses registered in a semester and the total course credits taken during that semester. It shall be expressed up to two decimal places.

The SGPA is the ratio of sum of the product of the number of credits with the grade points scored by a student in all the courses taken by a student and the sum of the number of credits of all the courses undergone by a student, i.e

SGPA (Si) =
$$\sum$$
 (Ci x Gi) / \sum Ci

where Ci is the number of credits of the i_{th} course and Gi is the grade point scored by the student in the i_{th} course.

- 2. Semester Grade Point Average (GPA) is awarded to a candidate who passes in all the subject papers in the Semester
- 3. Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) is calculated by the end of third year using similar formula provided a candidate passes in all subject papers of all the three years.
- 4. The CGPA is also calculated in the same manner taking into account all the courses undergone by a student over all the semesters of a programme, i.e.

$$CGPA = \sum (Ci \times Si) / \sum Ci$$

where Si is the SGPA of the ith semester and Ci is the total number of credits in that semester.

5. CGPA is multiplied by '10' give aggregate % of marks obtained by a candidate.

ATTENDANCE

Certificate Courses: All Departments are offering several skill-based certificate courses such as Classical Dance, Classical Music, Hand Embroidery, Garment making cum Fabric Painting, Tailoring Course, Type Writing Techniques etc.

The Department of H. Sc. conducted certificate courses in 1. Hand Embroidery for 45 days. 2. Garment making cum Fabric Painting for 15 days. 3. Tailoring Course for 45 days.

STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES

- 1) College Library: The College has a sizable Library. Since its inception, the library is being upgraded from time to time to the requirement of the learners. It provides newspapers, magazines, and reference books for various subjects needed by the students. It functions from 9.00 am to 6.00 pm. A collection of 30,000 books is available in the library for the access of students and staff. Net and xerox facilities are an added advantage to the students to get the information. In addition to the above facilities, an e-learning centre is also arranged in the library.
- 2) Physical Education: The department is well established having the equipment of Gym, Exercise cycles, body massager, indoor games like Weightlifting, Chess, TT, Carroms, and outdoor games like Basketball, Volleyball, Shuttle, Badminton, Kabaddi etc. Regular coaching is provided to the interested students by the Physical Director of the College.

3) NCC: The College has an NCC unit (3 (A) Girls Battalion) sensitization programme is conducted every year to motivate and mobilize the students to enrol themselves in NCC. NCC prepares the youth for careers in defence services and trains them to lead an integrated and disciplined life.

4) JKC: The JKC of the College is committed to providing employability skills to the students to meet the demands of the global job market.

5) NSS: The NSS units in the college are providing a platform for the student youth to learn and serve the community. they undertake rural community service, adult education, campus beautification etc. There are two NSS units with an enrolment of 100 volunteers in each unit. The first- and second-year students who are interested in social service can enrol themselves in the units.

The main objective is to conduct consumer awareness programmes among the students. Guest lectures, elocution essay writing, quiz and debate are conducted on topics related to consumer education.
- **9) Red Ribbon Club:** The youth Red Cross Unit of the College started Red Ribbon Club in 2005. The main objective is to educate the student on the importance and need of blood donation, conducting blood donation camps, AIDS awareness programmes.
- **10**) **English Club:** The College has English Club. The main objective is to promote English learning skills among the students, It conducts workshops and certificate courses in English communication skills. It takes English test series to test their skill in English.
- 11) Health Centre: The College has a health centre in the campus working from 4 pm to 6pm daily. Dr. G. Krishnaveni, MBBS, DGO is the doctor in charge of this centre. For all the students Health check-up will be done and health cards are issued.
- **12) NET Centre:** A well-equipped internet centre at JKC and computer labs is available to our students to access latest information and enrich knowledge. Wife facility is also available the campus.
- **13) Mana TV:** Mana tv programmes that are telecasted by CCE, Hyderabad is regularly watched by our students to gain additional knowledge.
- **14)** Women Empowerment Cell: Women empowerment cell was established to create awareness among the girl students on women issues and problems, condemning the social evil, developing scientific knowledge. Sensitization programmes and seminars are conducted under this cell to empower the girl students.
- **15) Career Guidance Cell:** The students are created awareness and motivated on pursuing higher studies and are provided with the information of P.G. entrance tests and employment opportunities. Study material is also provided to the students.

- **16**) **Grievance Redressal Cell:** The Grievance redressal Cell of the College addresses the problems of the students. A grievance box is provided by the cell near the office in which the students can drop a letter of their grievance. The grievances received will be redressed by the committee.
- 17) R.O. Plant: The campus has a self-maintained water purification (RO) plant for students.
- **18) Hostels:** The College has two attached hostels accommodating 300 students. The student Management Hostel is spacious and well equipped with basic amenities. There are three Govt. Hostels outside campus, run by Dept. of Social Welfare.
