The Department of English organized a Two-Day National Seminar under IQAC on the topic 'Post-Colonial Indian Fiction' on 24th and 25th February 2023. The seminar intended to motivate both teachers and students to take up research in Postcolonial Indian fiction and to develop and rebuild knowledge in diverse areas of contemporary fiction in the present multicultural world. Brochure was released by Principal, Dr. V. Anantha Lakshmi, Department faculty and Incharges of other departments. All the details of the Conduct of the Seminar was given in the brochure like theme of the Seminar, Call for papers with Sub-themes and dates of submission of Abstract and full length papers. Dr. P. Sanjotha is the Convenor, Dr.P.Shanthi Coconvenor and Ms.Y.Swarna Sri the Organizing Secretary.

The Seminar was planned for 4 sessions including Inaugural, Valedictory & Paper presentation sessions. On the first day the seminar began with Inaugural session. Prof. T. Ashok, Register of Adikavi Nannayya University was the Chief Guest and Keynote addressee. Organizing Secretary Ms. Y. Swarna Sri invited the guests on to the dais and the programme started with lighting the lamp by the dignitaries and a theme song. Principal Dr. V. Anantha Lakshmi, the President of the programme gave the opening remarks. Dr. P. Sanjotha convenor welcomed the delegates and conveyed the purpose of organizing the Seminar. Dr. P. Santhi, Coconvenor introduced the Chief Guest, Prof. T. Ashok, AKNU and invited him to give the keynote address. Then followed greetings by special invitees Prof. T. Viswanadh Rao, (Rtd) AUMSN PG Center KKD, Smt. M. Suwarchala, Vice Principal, Ms. M. Vasantha Lakshmi, IQAC Coordinator.
