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Resolutions:

Approval of resolutions of BoS meetings of various departments for the academic year 2022-2023.

Discussion: The Academic Council discussed on the BoS meetings resolutions of all the Departments. The Departments have made changes in syllabi wherever necessary ranging from 10 -20 % as is admissible under Autonomy. The Departments have presented the changes made in their BoS meetings along with justification before the Academic Council for consideration and approval.

Resolution:

The changes made in the BoS meetings of various departments have been approved by the Academic Council.

Proposed to revise the existing evaluation pattern of 25 Internal and 75 External assessment to 40 Internal and 60 External assessment

Discussion: The Academic Council discussed on the revision of existing evaluation pattern of 25 Internal and 75 External assessment to 40 Internal and 60 External assessment. The proposal made in their BoS meetings along with justification was placed before the Academic Council for consideration and approval. Majority of the departments opined to revise 25:75 assessment pattern to 40: 60 assessment pattern in order to bring Examination reforms which gives a scope to engage the students in the assigned academic and curricular activities and assess their performance and to even boost their skills and competitive spirit.

Resolution: Taking into consideration the opinion of the departments for revision of the existing evaluation pattern of 25:75 assessment pattern to 40: 60 assessment pattern which has been accepted by the members of BoS, the Academic Council has approved the revised assessment pattern.

It is also resolved to approve the question paper pattern for external 60 marks as in

Section- B: 5 questions to answer out of 8 with marks 5x4 = 20

Section-A: 5 questions with internal choice with marks 5x8 = 40

Total = 60

Resolved to approve the implementation of new Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) introduced by APCCE from 2021-2022 admitted batch onwards as per the pattern shown below by adopting the question paper consisting of 5 Marks (2 out 3 questions), 2 Marks (5 out of 7 questions) and 1 Mark Questions (10 out of 10 questions).

Discussion: Members of the Academic Council discussed on the introduction of 3 new UG courses permitted by CCE,AP. Mangalgiri which were also sanctioned by the affiliating university, AKNU, Rajamahendravaram. The members felt that the courses are market-oriented courses that provide employability skills for getting employment as well as to become Women Entrepreneurs.

Resolution: The council approved the introduction of new 3 UG courses from the academic year 2022-23.

4. Proposed to introduce a PG Course, M.Sc Organic Chemistry from the academic year 2023-24

Discussion: Members of the Academic Council discussed on the introduction of new PG course M.Sc Organic Chemistry as proposed to introduce by the department of Chemistry with the demand for the course from the girl students. It is noticed that the parents are unwilling to send their children (girls) to distant places with the fear of safety and security issues as a result the merit students are unable to pursue higher education. Hence, the Department of Chemistry felt the need to introduce PG Course in Organic Chemistry.

Resolution: The council approved the introduction of new PG course M.Sc Organic Chemistry from the next academic year i.e., 2023-24.

5. Presentation of results of II Semester 2020-21 and I, III, V, VI semesters for the academic year 2021-22

Discussion: The subject wise results of all semesters are shown in the annexure-II along with paper wise and Teacher wise analysis. Results are placed before the Academic Council for necessary suggestions and approval. The Council appreciated for timely release of results i.e within 20 days after completion of examinations and congratulated the departments who secured 80-100%. Further, discussed on the reasons for getting below 40% results in a few courses of Semesster-I (2021-22).
