### 2. BLOOD GROUPING AND BLOOD DONATION CAMP FO THE STUDENTS IN COLLABORATION WITH ROTARY BLOOD BANK, KAKINADA

Blood grouping and blood donation camp was conducted by the Health Committee ,NSS Units I & II and Red Ribbon Club of the college on 06-01-2020. In this camp 366 students were tested for blood grouping and blood donation was done by 48 students. Principal, Vice Principal, NSS Coordinators, Members of Health Committee, members of Red Ribbon Club and other staff members participated in the camp.



### 3. AWARENESS PROGRAMME ON BASIC LIFE SUPPORT(BLS) IN COLLABORATION WITH MEDICOVER HOSPITALS, KAKINADA

On 18th July 2022, a programme on Basic Life Support was conducted in collaboration with Medicover Hospitals, Kakinada. In this programme, Dr.V.J.Ch. Prakash, Head of the department and Chief Consultant, Department of Emergency Medicine, Medicover Hospitals, Kakinada has acted as Resource Person. He has explained the meaning, importance of Basic Life Support and the demonstrated the process of giving Basic Life Support.

Basic life support (BLS) is a level of medical care which is used for patients with life threatening illnesses or injuries until they can be given full medical care by advanced life support providers (paramedics, nurses, physicians). It can be provided by trained medical personnel, such as emergency medical technicians, and by qualified bystanders. Basic life support (BLS) includes recognition of signs of sudden cardiac arrest, heart attack, stroke, and foreign body airway obstruction, and the performance of cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and defibrillation with an automated external defibrillator. Cardiac arrests and accidents are the most common type of emergencies with grave consequences, but simple maneuvers and skills can improve the outcome, and immediate CPR can double or triple the chances of survival. The majority of patients who

experience an out-of-hospital cardiac arrest do not receive adequate resuscitation by health care professionals within the critical time, 3–5 min after onset, thus reducing the chance of survival. The chance of successful resuscitation after sudden cardiac arrest decreases by 7–10% with every minute that resuscitation is delayed. The students were made to practice one by one on the process of giving basic life support.Principal Dr.V.Anantha Lakshmi, Vice Principal Smt Suvarchala, Health committee convenor Dr.K.Lavanya, Members Kum. P. Rajya Lakshmi, Smt.P.Pushpa Latha, 60 students from B.A, B.Com, B.Sc. and personnel from Medicover hospitals participated in the progamme.

### 5. HEALTH CAMP FOR STUDENTS AND STAFF OF THE COLLEGE IN COLLABORATION WITH MEDICOVER HOSPITALS

On 3<sup>rd</sup> September, 2022 a Health camp was conducted for the staff and the students of the college in collaboration with Medicover Hospitals. In this programme, nearly 600 students and 20 teaching and non-teaching staff members participated and have undergone health Checkup. Medical and paramedical staff from Medicover hospitals have conducted the examination of the students. Dr. Lakshmi Praveena, General Physician and Dr.K.Niroopa, Orthopaedician, 4 paramedical staff participated in the camp. Blood pressure and sugar levels of the staff members was tested and the necessary medical advice was given. Student's heights and weights, chest circumference on inspiration and expiration, blood group were noted down in their respective health cards maintained by the health committee. General health check-up was conducted for all the students and those students who had some health issues were given referral to the concerned specialists for further medical examination. Members of Health Committee, Members of Red Ribbon Club and other staff members participated in the camp.
