**The views expressed by students are as follows:**

This report synthesizes views expressed by students regarding social media, exploring both its perceived threats and innocuous aspects. Participants were asked to articulate their views on social media, considering both its positive and negative implications.

**1. Perceived Threats of Social Media**

- **Mental Health Concerns:** A significant number of students expressed concerns about the negative effects of social media on mental health. Many cited issues such as anxiety, depression, and low self-esteem, often linked to cyberbullying and the pressure to maintain a perfect online image.
- **Privacy Issues:** Students highlighted the risks associated with privacy breaches. Concerns about data security and the potential misuse of personal information were prominent, with many feeling that their online activities were constantly monitored.
- **Misinformation:** The spread of false information on social media was another major concern. Students noted that misinformation could have serious consequences, especially regarding public health, politics, and social issues.
- **Addiction and Distraction:** Many students reported feeling addicted to social media, noting that it distracts from academic responsibilities and real-life interactions. This addiction was seen as a barrier to productivity and mental well-being.

**2. Views on the Innocuous Nature of Social Media**

- **Connection and Community:** Despite the concerns, many students emphasized the positive aspects of social media, particularly its ability to connect people. They noted that it helps maintain relationships, especially with friends and family who are geographically distant.

- **Platform for Expression:** Students appreciated social media as a space for self-expression and creativity. It allows them to share their opinions, art, and experiences, contributing to a sense of identity and belonging.
- **Access to Information:** Many students recognized social media as a valuable tool for accessing information quickly and staying informed about current events. They found it beneficial for educational purposes, such as following academic resources and engaging with expert opinions.
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- **Activism and Awareness:** Some students highlighted the role of social media in promoting social causes and activism. They pointed out how platforms can mobilize communities and raise awareness about important issues, fostering a sense of agency and involvement.
