





Importance of patri

Machi pathram (*Artmesia vulgaris*)

This is found all over the globe. These leaves have medicinal properties as they can cure nerve-related problems, stomach problems, and headaches. It can ease dry mouth syndrome and increases one's appetite.

Bruhathi Patram (*Solanum xanthocarpum*)

This plant grows only in the wild or open lands. It has thorny leaves and bitter fruits. Its flowers are white and yellow. The leaves are good for cough, heavy breathing, and mucus. The fruits are helpful in tooth infections. They are consumed like a vegetable.

Bilva Patram (*Aegle marmelos*)

These leaves are also common in Shiva worship. The leaves resemble his trident. The fruits were used instead of coconuts earlier. The essential oil of the Bilva tree is effective against 21 kinds of bacteria. It enables smooth bowel movement. People who have constipation and other gastrointestinal issues can benefit from it.

Dhurvayugmam (*Aruham pul*) – *Cynodon dactylon*

The common name for Durvayugmam is 'Garika' or 'Bermuda Grass'. The Jaimaneyya Bharatham says that this grass was formed from the body hair of King Prajapathi. Devotees make garlands with this grass and offer them to Ganesha. This grass is good for digestion and can cure stomach ailments. Dogs with stomach problems often eat this grass. Hence it got the name 'Dogs' tooth grass. The grass has lots of chlorophyll, which is alkaline. It also has many nutrients and minerals. It is also used to control pests and treat skin diseases.

Durthaara(Umathai) – *Datura metel*

Datura metel is a perennial herb. Its common name is devil's trumpet. Other names are 'Ummetta', 'Unmatta', and 'Kanaka'. All parts of this plant have dangerous levels of tropane alkaloids (highly toxic). It can be fatal if ingested by humans or animals.

Badhari (Ilandai) – *Zizyphus jujuba*

Another name for it is 'Regu'. Its fruit is tasty and boosts appetite. It also helps the body heal quickly from cuts and bruises. A thorny tree, it grows in dry areas. Its fruits are very nutritious. Snakes generally avoid this tree due to its thorns. Hence birds like sparrows, etc., build their

nests in it as it is free of snakes or other reptiles. The fruit finds mention in the Ramayana. Shabari offered them to Lord Rama after tasting them.

Apaamaarga (Nayuruvi) – *Achyranthes aspera*

This plant has medicinal properties and is an ingredient in some tooth powders, etc. The dried stems are used as Samith or sticks for Sudarshana Homa. The leaves can cure stomach pain, indigestion, and eczema.

Tulasi – *Ocimum sanctum*

Tulasi is very sacred to Hindus. Many Hindus households grow Tulasi in their backyards. It has many medicinal properties.

Chootha – *Mangifera indica*

Its common name is Mango leaf. The leaves are tied in front of the main entrances during auspicious functions in South India. They have good antiseptic properties. People use them when making Purna Kumbham.

Karaveera (Arali) – *Nerium oleander/indicum*

The scented flowers can be white, red, yellow, and pink. People offer them separately or as garlands to God. It is a very poisonous garden plant.

VishnuKrantha – *Evolvulus alsinoides*

Vishnukranta or Aparajita is very important in Ayurveda. It is a Medhya drug which boosts memory and intelligence. Thus, it has neuroprotective capabilities. It can also cure bladder and urethra-related diseases, bronchitis, ascites, etc.

Dhadimi(Mathulai) – *Punica granatum*

Its common name is Pomegranate. The seeds are compared to Lord Krishna's teeth. The seeds of this fruit have lots of iron and other minerals/ vitamins. The fruit's shell or membrane is very bitter. Ayurvedic healers dry and preserve this to make a tea for stomach problems.

Devadaru – *Cedras deodara*

Its common name is Cedar tree. It has many medicinal qualities. The trees grow in cold places like the Himalayas. It can reduce body heat and is good for skin diseases and chronic wounds. The resins find use in making aromatic smokes (Dhoopam).

Maruvaka – Origanum marjoram

Its leaves are aromatic and find use in cooking. People cut the tops as the plants begin to flower and dry them in the shade. It is a part of herb combinations. Marjoram is an ingredient in seasoning soups, stews, dressings, and sauces. People make garlands with the leaves and flowers. The essential oils are good for joint pains and reducing body odor.

Sindhuvara (Vavilaku) – Viex nigundo

Keeping the leaves under the pillow during sleep helps reduce headaches. A paste of the leaves is good for sinus problems when applied to the forehead. The flowers help control cholera and liver problems. The leaves find use in Ayurvedic medicines.

Jaji (Jaji Malli) – Jasminum grandiflorum

Jaji leaves find use as Ayurvedic herbal medicine, and its flowers adorn the hair of women. The flowers have a strong smell. Both the leaves and flowers have medicinal properties.

Gandaki – Solonum nigrum

The plant's juice can heal mouth ulcers and skin diseases. The fruits find use as a tonic, laxative, appetite stimulant, etc. They are good for asthma and "excessive thirst". Traditionally, people used them to cure tuberculosis. They also cook them like spinach. In Northern India, the boiled extracts of leaves and berries are also used for liver-related ailments, including jaundice. In Assam, the juice from the roots is good for asthma and whooping cough.

Shamee (Vanni) – Prosopis spicigera

The tree is common in Shiva temples. People believe that Goddess "Aparajita Devi" lives in it. As per legend, the Pandavas hid their weapons on top of this tree during their exile.

Ashwattha – Ficus religiosa

Other names are Bodhi-tree, Pippala tree, Peepal tree, Ravi tree, or Ashwattha tree. This is a sacred tree for Hindus, Jains, and Buddhists. The Buddha attained enlightenment while meditating underneath this tree.

It finds use in traditional medicine for at least 50 kinds of ailments, including diabetes, asthma, epilepsy, diarrhea, gastric problems and inflammatory disorders, infectious and sexual disorders.

Arjuna – Terminalia arjuna

Its common name is Arjuna or Arjuna tree. The leaves find use in Ayurveda as a treatment for heart disease. It can heal wounds, hemorrhages, and ulcers. It can reduce the risks of heart failure.

Arka – Calotropis gigantea

Arka means 'Sun'. The plant's root bark is good for cold, cough, and constipation. In the old days, people used the plant's leaves to heal poisonous snake bites. Ayurvedic physicians process the leaves with Saindhava salt to make Arka Lavana, a medicine for gastritis. Its latex is good for toothache. Ayurvedic doctors use the leaves to treat leprosy, paralysis, and 64 diseases.

Conclusion

When we do Pooja with these 21 medicinal leaves for 9 days in the morning and evening, our body becomes pure and healthy. Devotees immerse Ganesh's clay idols in water bodies with all these leaves on the final day of Ganesh Chaturthi. This makes the water bodies clean, too, as the medicinal properties of the leaves purify the water.

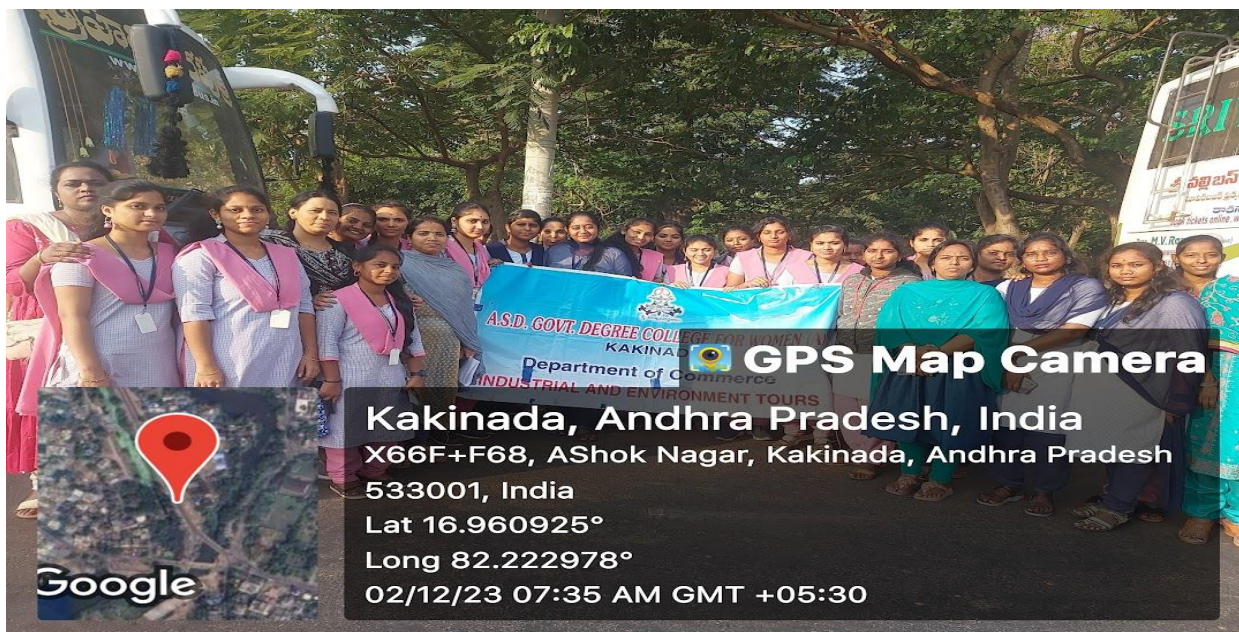

Detailed Report on Activities of Extension Activities Conducted by the Department of Commerce for the year 2023-24

- 1. Consumer Club Activity & Extension Activity – Awareness Programme on Consumer Rights (18th December 2023)** On 18th December 2023, the Department of Commerce's Consumer Club organized an extension activity on consumer rights awareness at Municipal Salipeta, Kakinada. The program, held just before National Consumer Day (24th December), aimed to educate the public about their rights under the Consumer Protection Act. A total of 110 participants, including students and local residents, attended the event. Faculty members from the Commerce department conducted the session, explaining the legal framework protecting consumers and providing practical advice on how to address grievances effectively. This activity played a crucial role in raising awareness about consumer rights in the community.



- 2. Consumer Club Activity & Extension Activity – Awareness Programme on Consumer Rights and Consumer Act 1986 (19th December 2023)** On 19th December 2023, the Department of Commerce's Consumer Club conducted another awareness programme, this time at ASD Junior College for Women. EXTENSION ACTIVITY

AWARENESS ON SOCIAL MEDIA & THREATS

Aims:

1. **To Foster Responsible Social Media Use:** Encourage students to understand the positive aspects of social media while promoting responsible and ethical online behavior.
2. **Raise Awareness on Cyber Threats:** Educate students about potential dangers and threats associated with social media, including cyberbullying, identity theft, and online predators.
3. **Equip Students with Digital Literacy Skills:** Provide students with the knowledge and skills necessary to critically evaluate information, verify sources, and navigate the digital landscape safely.

Objectives:

1. **Understand Social Media Platforms:**
 - Identify popular social media platforms.
 - Understand the purpose and features of each platform.
2. **Recognize Cyber Threats:**
 - Identify common cyber threats on social media.
 - Understand the consequences of cyberbullying and online harassment.
3. **Develop Critical Thinking Skills:**
 - Learn to evaluate the credibility of online information.
 - Understand the importance of fact-checking.
4. **Promote Responsible Digital Citizenship:**
 - Emphasize the concept of digital footprints.
 - Encourage responsible sharing and posting on social media.
5. **Enhance Online Privacy Awareness:**
 - Learn about privacy settings on various social media platforms.
 - Understand the importance of protecting personal information online.

Procedure:

- 1. Introduction (30 minutes):**
 - Brief overview of the importance of social media in today's world.
 - Discuss the positive and negative aspects of social media use.
- 2. Social Media Platform Exploration (30 minutes):**
 - Divide students into groups to explore different social media platforms.
 - Each group presents the purpose, features, and potential risks associated with their assigned platform.
- 3. Cyber Threats Exploration (30 minutes):**
 - Conduct interactive sessions on cyber threats such as cyberbullying, phishing, and identity theft.
 - Share real-life examples and case studies.
- 4. Digital Literacy Activities (30 minutes):**
 - Engage students in activities that enhance critical thinking skills.
 - Introduce fact-checking exercises and tools.
- 5. Responsible Digital Citizenship Discussion (30 minutes):**
 - Facilitate a discussion on the concept of digital citizenship.
 - Encourage students to share their thoughts on responsible online behavior.
- 6. Q&A and Reflection -Feedback (30 minutes):**
 - Allow students to ask questions and express their thoughts.
 - Facilitate a reflective discussion on what they've learned.

Report on the Extension Activity

Awareness on Social Media & Threats

The faculty of the Dept. of Computer Science & Computer Applications along with 8 student volunteers went to Batchu Ramam Municipal Girls High School, Kakinada on 18-12-2023 at 2.00 PM. They interacted with the girls students of Grade VI to IX and created awareness on Social media and the threats posed by it, if not used safely.

The views expressed by our students is as follows:

Social media platforms are ubiquitous nowadays, and have connected us in ways, ten years ago, we could never have imagined. We share information and updates instantaneously with the networks of connections we've built, and are subsequently flooded with updates from those same networks. While sharing information in this manner is advantageous for many reasons, it brings many risks along with it.

Oversharing information is arguably the biggest risk of using social media, and the ways in which it can be harmful are numerous. Potential burglars are watching for people on vacation, hackers are looking for information they can use to break into your accounts, scammers are looking for vulnerable people to swindle, and identity thieves are searching for good targets. There are many other examples, but the root issue is the same – too much information is available to people who shouldn't necessarily have access.

Cyberbullying is another issue that has risen to the forefront due to the increased use of social media. The internet has proven itself to be a forum where people feel very comfortable saying things that they would likely never say in person. Often, the problem is compounded by people posting without knowing all the facts in a given situation. It's important to be cognizant of your actions online, so that you don't contribute to such a problem, or become a victim.

Here are some tips provided to the school students to be more secure while using social media:

- Change the privacy of your posts and profiles. It may take a bit of research, but there will be some level of configuration available that allows you to restrict the visibility of your posts. Some sites allow a great deal of control over who can see your information, while others do not.
- Be careful about what you make visible to your network, but especially what you make public. You shouldn't make the name of your high school, your birthdate, your address, your children's or pets' names, or other personal information public. Many times, this information is used by scammers to pretend to be someone you know, or by hackers trying to force password resets on accounts. And, while it may be obvious, do not post social security numbers, credit card numbers, account numbers or other types of confidential/financial information.
- Turn off location services when you post to social media. You are announcing your location in real-time if you don't disable GPS/location services. Depending on the privacy controls of people you're

connected to, people outside your network might be able to see information that you don't want them to.

- Read the privacy policy and terms of service for the social media site. You may be surprised at what the site is allowed to do with your information, pictures and other data. If you decide that giving up some control of your data is worth using the site, that's fine, but you may want to restrict your posts and activities even further.
- Remember that you are building a brand with your posts. Social media is perfectly suited to expressing personal opinions, but you should use caution. A good rule of thumb for deciding what to post is to assume that at some point in the future, the post will become public, and to choose your words accordingly. Potential employers definitely check the social media posts of candidates, but current employers may have a policy on social media, and may check as well, to monitor for violations of their policy.
- Google yourself, and check out your social media profiles while logged out. This is a good sanity check to ensure that you've configured the privacy settings the way you want. Also, googling your own name can reveal fake accounts that have been opened by imposters.
- This may also be obvious, but don't accept connection requests or messages from strangers. You are not only allowing strangers to see your information, but the information of the people in your network. Messages sent in social media platforms can carry malicious links or attachments, just like phishing emails do. A good rule of thumb is – if you haven't met them in person, you probably should not connect.
- If you intend on having a profile open to the public for blogging, or building a professional presence online, create a separate profile for personal use. Lock the personal profiles down, and don't mix up the content between the two, ever.
- Be careful about commenting on others' public posts – your name will be attached to that public post until you delete your comment, or that person deletes the post.
- Educate yourself about each platform's capabilities for dealing with abusive, offensive, or illegal materials and interactions, so that you are prepared in situations of cyberbullying, harassment, or stalking.
- Be cautious about the apps (quizzes, games, etc.) that you allow to link to your social media profiles. These apps may be collecting personal information about you, beyond just your email address.
- Don't lie, harass, abuse, intimidate, or threaten people on social media. It may seem like common sense, but you can open yourself up to legal issues, criminal charges, or accusations of cyberbullying. Social media sites prohibit these types of behavior, anyway.

- Ensure the people in your networks are aware of how much information you want them to share about you. Don't be shy about asking a connection to remove or edit photo, tag, or other type of post related to you, if it is something that you cannot do yourself.
- Don't automatically trust that someone is who they purport to be – verify. Imposter profiles are a huge problem for social media platforms, related to identity theft and online harassment.
- Use two-factor authentication and strong passwords to secure your logins to social media. In particular, two-factor authentication will make it much more difficult for hackers to take over your accounts, even if your password is stolen. Most of the larger, well-known sites offer this feature.

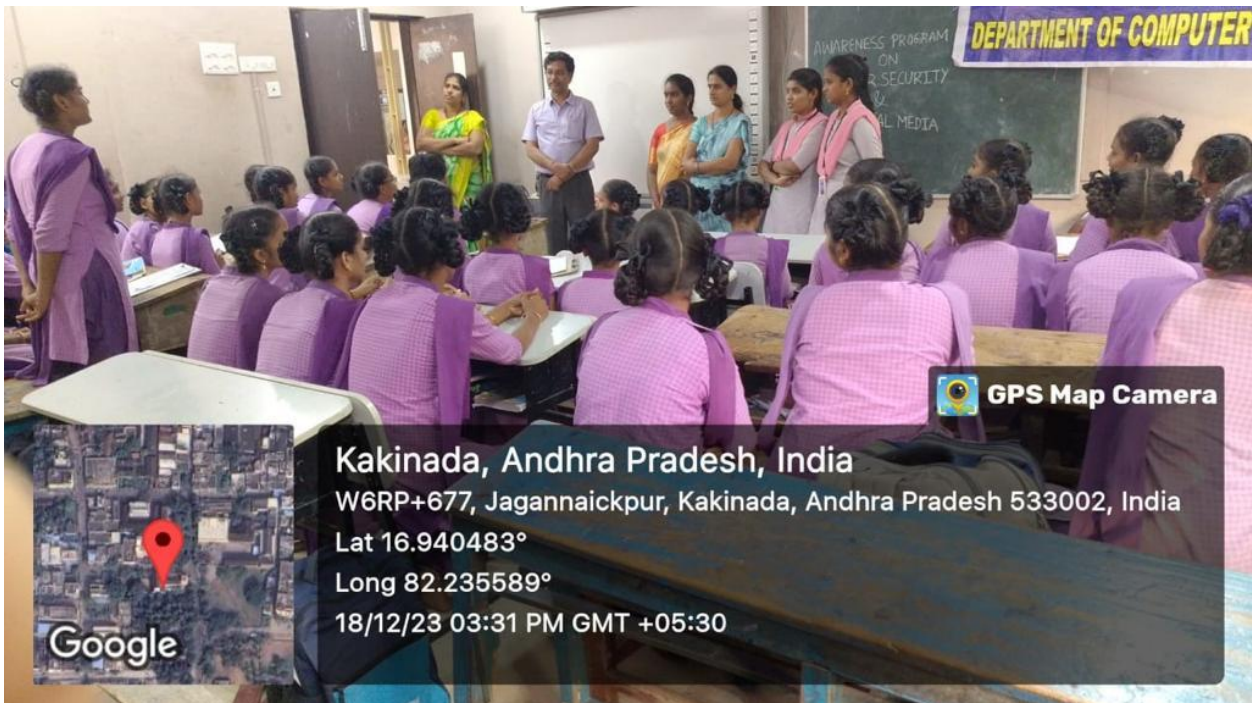
